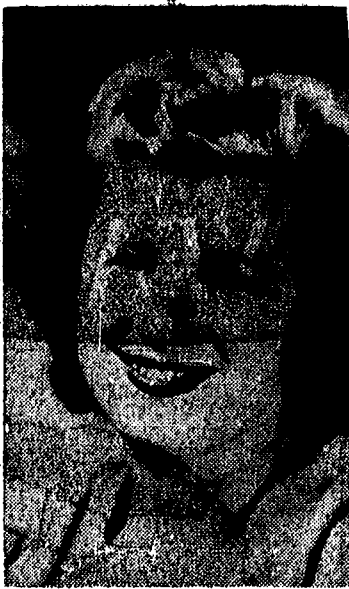
Reverend Mills read the double ring service at one o'clock in the afternoon.
