## Machines Crash At Ukiah Corner

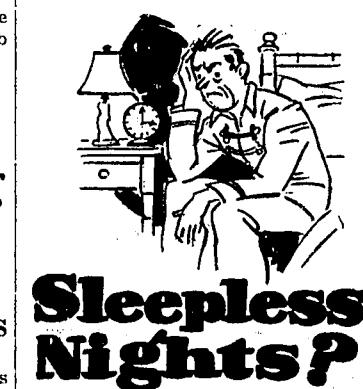

John Pippin, 75, of Willits passed away in his sleep Monday morning.

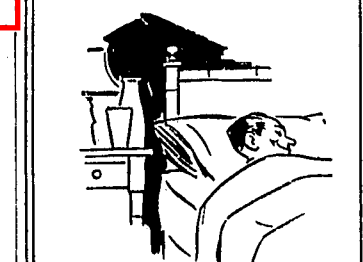
Deputy Coroner Beverly Broadus went to Willits Tuesday morning to investigate the case, but found death from natural causes.
