

# M'AULIFFE RELATES VARIOUS TALES

## Policeman Testifies Con- cerning Former Confes- sions Made by the Boy CASE STRENGTHENED

The coils were tightened around Franklin D. McAuliffe, accused of the murder of Fred Mulnix on the Ocean Beach on August 12, by the testimony yesterday in Judge Dunne's court of James J.
